Brief description of the programme

By keeping in view, the importance of theatre, the World Theatre Day was observed by Gargaon College from 27th to 30th March, 2022. The programme was jointly organized by the departments of Assamese and English in collaboration with IQAC Gargaon College, with a drama workshop, dialogue delivery competition and a puppet theatre show under the aegis of Badminton Coaching Centre. Brief description of the programme

Traditional string theatre known as puppetry (Putola Nach) has been around for ages and is particularly well-liked throughout all of Northeast India, not just in Assam. One of the most popular types of entertainment, particularly among kids, was "Putola Nach". Even though the Putola Nach is well-known in Assam, the idea behind its performance has existed since the Mahabharata era. Along with the drama competition, a puppet theatre show was also organized in the Gargaon College premises. The program was inaugurated by, Shri Tuloshi Sensua, Retired Professor, Gargaon College. The puppetry shows were staged by the Ronghor theatre group during the evenings from 28th March. Three theatre shows namely, Rubul Mhanta's Shakuntala, Khitish Bora's Bharaghor and Moi Aro Mur Saa were staged which gathered tremendous appreciation from the audience.

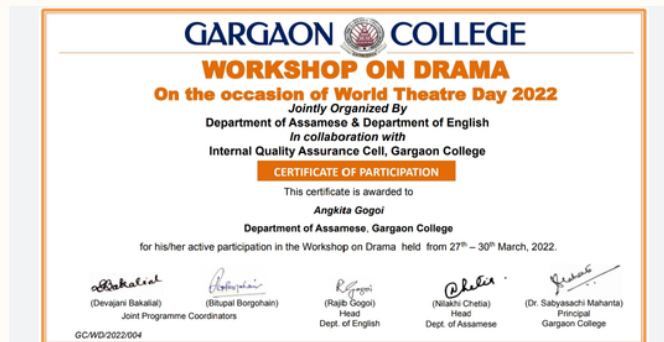

It also imparts to students life skills, communication and problem-solving skills and contributes to their overall personality development. With such an objective in mind, a drama workshop, dialogue delivery competition and a puppet theatre show under the aegis of Badminton Coaching Centre was organized by the departments of Assamese and English respectively in collaboration with IQAC, Gargaon College from 27th to 30th March, 2022 on the occasion of World Theatre Day, 2022.
