INTRODUCTION

The NSS unit of Gargaon College in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Rohdoi organised a Special Camp from 7th to 13th April, 2023 at Longak Gohain Gaon. Langak Gohain Gaon is the adopted village of Gargaon College. Dr. Rimjim Borah, the programme officer visited the adopted village on 6.4.2023 and informed the stakeholders of the village about the camp at that village. They agreed for the camp to be organised from 7th to 13thApril, 2023.

The main theme of this special camp was 'Gender Issues, Women Empowerment, Entrepreneurship, Good Health and Hygiene'.

Special Camping Programme provides unique opportunities to the NSS volunteers for team work, students for group living, collective experience sharing with each other develops social consciousness and commitment, constant interaction with the local community and positive attitudes towards the community. Mrs Sumana Hazarika (Women Entrepreneur), Basanta Nath (Bamboo Artist), Dr. Anupananda Goswami (Subject Matter Specialist, Animal Science, Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Rohdoi) and Dipjyoti Gowala (Ex -NSS Volunteer of Gargaon College) provided various training to all women of Longkak Gohain Gaon. Dr. Rimjim Borah provided training on life skill development. Ms. Smitee Knower, Apurba Saikia and Jahnobi Phukon, Jahan Ali, Kaustav Chetia and other volunteers provided Self Defence, Yoga, Art and Craft Training to all the children of the village. All total 35 volunteers, more than 13 faculties of Gargaon College and all children of women of Longkak Gohain Gaon participated in this camp.
