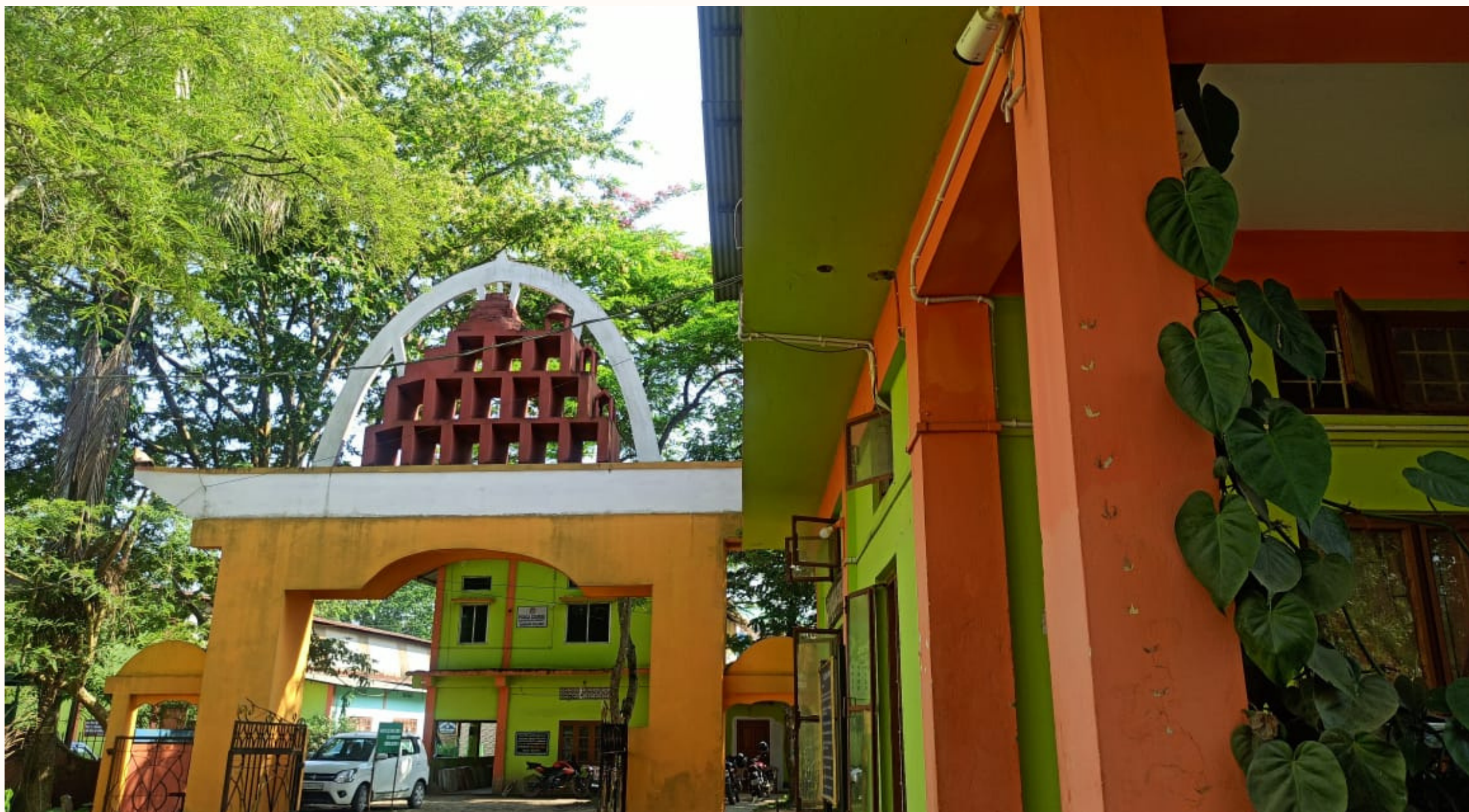


Specific facilities provided for women



SAFETY AND SECURITY

- The college has a girl's hostel where students are accommodated safely with the provision of boundary wall and security.
- One lady teacher is appointed as the Warden Security of every student is assured within the buildings and premises of the college, with an appointed security guard for crowd control.
- There is constant CCTV monitoring inside the classrooms as well as in corridors of the college campus. Night watchmen and security guards are positioned to ensure the safety and security of the college property
- Security is tightened during major events and there are security checkpoints at all campus entries and exits. Pectoral duty is carried out by faculty members for discipline and security
- Fire extinguishers are deployed at strategic points in the entire campus.
- The college has an Anti-Ragging Committee which ensures the strict compliance of anti-ragging measures with special care for girl's student.
- Gender Sensitization and Sexual Harassment Committee deals with the gender issues of the college.
- There is two Women Cell of the College under Gargaon College Teachers' Unit and IQAC to take care different issues to bring equity subject to gender at the college.





COUNSELLING

- a) Different Counseling programmes related to Girl's Student were organized by different Committees and Cells of the programme like Women's Cell, NSS, Girl's Hostel, IQAC etc.
- b) Students are counselled on stress and anger management by their mentors as well as by organizing workshops and camps.
